Mourning a Beauty while Hunting the Beasts

Although the title is reminiscent of a familiar Disney tale, this real life story of a beautiful woman ends tragically, when her life was taken far too soon. Miss Venezuela 2004 is the beauty at the center of this heart-wrenching event, along with her ex-husband and their five-year old daughter.

On January 6, 2014, Monica Spears, 29, her ex husband, Thomas Henry Berry, 39, and their five-year old daughter were driving through Venezuela when their car became disabled due to a flat tire. They tried to maintain their safety by locking their vehicle's doors; however, that was not enough to hold back the threat that was coming from the other side. Monica and Thomas were fatally shot through the car windows, while their young child survived despite taking a bullet to the leg.

This crime has left the police and investigators to pick up the pieces and attempt to find and charge the guilty party. Police Commissioner, Jose Gregoria Sierralta, believes that the criminals' motive was robbery. A few members from a Puerto Cabello gang, El Cambur Savages are the prime suspects in this case and are believed to have put tire spikes in the road to cause the victims' flat tire. When the police searched the suspects' residences, they found the victims' items, including a digital camera that belonged to Monica Spears.

Although the outcome of this attack was gruesome and heartbreaking, it is not uncommon in this region. According to Mery Mogollon and Chris Kraul, "Venezuela has one of the highest homicide rates in the hemisphere." Venezuelan President, Nicolas Maduro already has plans to reduce the amount of firearms in the country.
